









Recipes for “Syllable Soup” Syllable Types

Recipe Name	Ingredients	Steps	Serves	
Closed Syllable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 a, e, i, o or u 1 or more tail letters – can’t be r, w or y 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> add to pot vowel sound is short soup is orange 	makes 1 pot	
Open Syllable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 a, e, i, o or u NO tail letters 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> add to pot vowel sound is long soup is blue 	makes 1 pot	
Silent-e Syllable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 a, e, i, o or u 1 tail letter* silent e 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> add to pot vowel sound is long soup is blue 	makes 1 pot	
Nose Blend Syllable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1 a, i, o or u ng or nk (update closed recipe that tail also can’t be ng or nk)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> melt vowel with ng/nk says nose blend sound soup is green 	makes 1 pot	
Walking Vowel Team Syllable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 2 vowel letters 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> two vowels go walking, first one does talking vowel sound is long soup is blue 	makes 1 pot	
R-Control Syllable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> vowel r 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> melt vowel with r says r-control sound soup is pink 	makes 1 pot	
Wrestling Vowel Team Syllable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 2 vowel letters 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> melt vowels into new sound says wrestling sound soup is purple 	makes 1 pot	
L Blend Syllable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> l-blend e 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> says l-blend sound must be last syllable soup is yellow 	makes 1 pot	

“melt” essentially means that the sounds combine into a memorized sound.

* silent-e does not typically “jump” over ending blends. The exception to this is *st* (taste, paste, waste), but it’s less confusing to generalize the rule and treat this as an exception.
